ORDINANCE NO. 422

**ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND REENACT PART I, CHAPTER I, SECTION
2(b) – ELECTION DISTRICTS, OF THE SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE CHARTER
OF THE CITY OF PLAQUEMINE, REDISTRICTING PLAN:
CITY OF PLAQUEMINE – PLAN 2022**

WHEREAS, the members of the Board of Selectman of the City of Plaquemine are elected from single-member districts; and,

WHEREAS, interposing the population data from the 2020 federal decennial census into the current districting plan for the City of Plaquemine discloses that there are districts within the plan the exceed the acceptable population deviation under the principle of one-person-one-vote; and,

WHEREAS, Louisiana law requires the City of Plaquemine to declare whether its existing districting plan is malapportioned following a federal decennial census; and,

WHEREAS, Louisiana law requires that if an unequal apportionment of the municipal population exists, that municipality shall by Ordinance change the boundaries of municipal districts to reflect as nearly as possible an equal apportionment of said population, and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Selectman of the City of Plaquemine have acknowledged that the current, existing district plan is malapportioned utilizing the population data from the 2020 federal decennial census, and has adopted by Ordinance a new districting plan for use in the next regularly scheduled election at the special meeting held on December 29, 2022 of the Board of Selectman; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Selectman of the City of Plaquemine must now amend and reenact Part I, Chapter I, Section 2(b) – Election Districts, of the Charter for the City of Plaquemine to match the newly drawn, described and adopted by Ordinance on December 29, 2022 the six (6) single-member election districts as described by said Ordinance and as described below as District 1 – 6; and,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN OF
THE CITY OF PLAQUEMINE, LOUISIANA TO AMEND AND REENACT PART I, CHAPTER
I, SECTION 2(b) – ELECTION DISTRICTS, OF THE SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE CHARTER OF
THE CITY OF PLAQUEMINE, REDISTRICTING PLAN 2022:**

§1. The redistricting plan entitled City of Plaquemine – Plan 2022, as described below and further specified and clarified by the maps, electronic shapefiles and electronic block equivalency files submitted to the Louisiana Secretary of State and provided to the Board of Selectman of the City of Plaquemine and the Registrar of Voters of Iberville Parish, was adopted by ordinance of the Board of Selectman of the City of Plaquemine at a special meeting called and held on December 29, 2022 for that purpose and such plan shall be utilized for the next regularly scheduled election for the City of Plaquemine in accordance with Louisiana Law.

§2. The City of Plaquemine shall cause a newspaper ad to be published advertising for three (3) weeks the proposed amendment to Part I, Chapter I, Section 2(b) of the Charter for the City of Plaquemine as provided by LSA R.S. 33:1181.

§3. Part I, Chapter I, Section 2(b) of the Charter for the City of Plaquemine shall be amended and reenacted to describe the new election districts to elect the six (6) Selectmen of the City of Plaquemine from six (6) single-member election districts as described below and as described per that ordinance adopted by the Board of Selectman of the City of Plaquemine at a special meeting called and held on December 29, 2022 for that purpose. Part I, Chapter I, Section 2(b) of the Charter for the City of Plaquemine shall be amended and reenacted as provided by LSA R.S. 33:1181 and LSA R.S. 33:1181.1 by the Board of Selectman of the City of Plaquemine to amend the legal description of the six (6) single-member election districts as described below for Districts 1 – 6:

District 1

Beginning at the intersection of State Route 1 and Schnebelen St, then northeast on Schnebelen St to its intersection with Kurzweg St, then south on Kurzweg St to its intersection with Foundry St, then east and southeast on Foundry St to its intersection with Nadler St, then north on Nadler St to its intersection with Turner St, then northeast on Turner St to its intersection with Dalbor St, then northwest on Dalbor St to its intersection with Short St, then northeast on Short St to its intersection with Turner St, then northwest on Turner St to its intersection with Jacob St, then southwest on Jacob St to its intersection with Warren St, then north on Warren St to its intersection with Trosclair St, then west on Trosclair St to its intersection with Hwy 1, then north on Hwy 1 to its intersection with Government St, then east on Government St to its intersection with Warren St, then north on Warren St to its intersection with the corporate boundary of Plaquemine, then counterclockwise on the boundary to its intersection with Bayou Plaquemine, then

northeast on Bayou Plaquemine to its intersection with State Route 1, then northwest on State Route 1 to the point of beginning.

District 2

Beginning at the intersection of Bayou Plaquemine and State Route 1, then southeast on State Route 1 to its intersection with Main St, then east on Main St to its intersection with Seminary St, then south on Seminary St to its intersection with Court St, then west on Court St to its intersection with Constitution St, then north on Constitution St to its intersection with Barker Alley, then west on Barker Alley to its intersection with East St, then south on East St to its intersection with Division St, then west on Division St to its intersection with Federal St, then south on Federal St to its intersection with Plaquemine St, then west on Plaquemine St to its intersection with Clay St, then south on Clay St to its intersection with Court St, then west on Court St to its intersection with Peters St, then south on Peters St to its intersection with Meriam St, then west on Meriam St to its intersection with Marshal St, then south on Marshal St to its intersection with Allen St, then west on Allen St to its intersection with Levy St, then north on Levy St to its intersection with WW Harleaux Blvd, then west on WW Harleaux Blvd to its intersection with the corporate boundary of Plaquemine, then north on the boundary to its intersection with Bayou Plaquemine, then northeast on Bayou Plaquemine to the point of beginning.

District 3

Beginning at the intersection of State Route 1 and Schnebelen St, then northeast on Schnebelen St to its intersection with Kurzweg St, then south on Kurzweg St to its intersection with Foundry St, then east and southeast on Foundry St to its intersection with Nadler St, then north on Nadler St to its intersection with Turner St, then northeast on Turner St to its intersection with Dalbor St, then northwest on Dalbor St to its intersection with Short St, then northeast on Short St to its intersection with Turner St, then northwest on Turner St to its intersection with Jacob St, then southwest on Jacob St to its intersection with Warren St, then north on Warren St to its intersection Trosclair St, then west on Trosclair St to its intersection with Hwy 1, then north on Hwy 1 to its intersection with Government St, then east on Government St to its intersection with Warren St, then north on Warren St to its intersection with the corporate boundary of Plaquemine, then clockwise on the boundary to its intersection with Eden St, then northwest on Eden St to its intersection with LaBauve Ave, then southwest on LaBauve Ave to its intersection with Baist St, then south on Baist St to its intersection with Elm St, then southwest on Elm St to its intersection with Marshall St, then north on Marshall St to its intersection with Meriam St, then east on Meriam St to its intersection with Peters St, then north on Peters St to its intersection with Court St, then east on Court St to its intersection with Clay St, then north on Clay St to its intersection with Plaquemine St, then east on Plaquemine St to its intersection with Federal St, then north on Federal St to its intersection with Division St, then east on Division St to its intersection with East St, then north on East St to its intersection with Barker Alley, then east on Barker Alley to its intersection with Constitution St, then south on Constitution St to its intersection with Court St, then east on Court St to its intersection with Seminary St, then north on Seminary St to its intersection with Main St, then west on Main St to its intersection with State Route 1, then northwest on State Route 1 to the point of beginning.

District 4

Beginning at the intersection of the corporate boundary of Plaquemine and Eden St, then northwest on Eden St to its intersection with LaBauve Ave, then southwest on LaBauve Ave to its intersection with Baist St, then south on Baist St to its intersection with Elm St, then southwest on Elm St to its intersection with Marshall St, then south on Marshall St to its intersection with Saint Clement Ave, then southwest on Saint Clement Ave to its intersection with Regina St, then southeast on Regina St to its intersection with Price St, then southwest on Price St to its intersection with Sabastian St, then south on Sabastian St to its intersection with the corporate boundary of Plaquemine, then east and south on the boundary to its intersection with Belleview Dr, then southwest on Belleview Dr to its intersection with Pecan Place, then south on Pecan Place to its intersection with the corporate boundary of Plaquemine, then counterclockwise on the boundary to the point of beginning.

District 5

Beginning at the intersection of Marshall St and Saint Clement Ave, then southwest on Saint Clement Ave to its intersection with Regina St, then southeast on Regina St to its intersection with Price St, then southwest on Price St to its intersection with Sabastian St, then south on Sabastian St to its intersection with the corporate boundary of Plaquemine, then east and south on the boundary to its intersection with Belleview Dr, then southwest on Belleview Dr to its intersection with Pecan Place, then south on Pecan Place to its intersection with the corporate boundary of Plaquemine, then clockwise on the boundary to its

intersection with an unnamed canal located near the coordinates (-91.255035, 30.270366), then west on the canal to its intersection with Sherwood Dr, then north on Sherwood Dr to its intersection with Evangeline Ave, then west on Evangeline Ave to its intersection with a canal located near the coordinates (-91.253597, 30.273175) , then northeast, south and northeast on the canal to its intersection with Iron Farm Rd, then northeast on Iron Farm Rd to its intersection with Sebastian St, then south on Sebastian St to its intersection with Delacroix Ave, then northeast on Delacroix Ave to its intersection with Marshall St, then southeast on Marshall St to its intersection with to the point of beginning.

District 6

Beginning at the intersection of Delacroix Ave and Marshall St, then north on Marshall St to its intersection with Allen St, the east on Allen St to its intersection with Levy St, then north on Levy St to its intersection with WW Harleaux Blvd, then west on WW Harleaux Blvd to its intersection with the corporate boundary of Plaquemine, then counterclockwise on the boundary to its intersection with an unnamed canal located near the coordinates (-91.255035, 30.270366), then west on the canal to its intersection with Sherwood Dr, then north on Sherwood Dr to its intersection with Evangeline Ave, then west on Evangeline Ave to its intersection with a canal located near the coordinates (-91.253597, 30.273175) , then northeast, south and northeast on the canal to its intersection with Iron Farm Rd, then northeast on Iron Farm Rd to its intersection with Sebastian St, then south on Sebastian St to its intersection with Delacroix Ave, then east on Delacroix Ave to the point of beginning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Mayor and the Board of Selectmen of the City of Plaquemine, Louisiana, that all other Charter provision, or parts of Charter Provision in conflict herewith are hereby repealed in their entirety.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Mayor and the Board of Selectmen of the City of Plaquemine, Louisiana, that it is the intention of the City that the provisions of this Special Legislative Charter Amendment to Part I, Chapter I, Section 2(b) be construed, enforced, and interpreted in such a manner as will cause the least possible infringement of the constitutional rights of free speech, free expression, due process, equal protection or other fundamental rights consistent with the purposes of this article and the one man - one vote principal. Should a court of competent jurisdiction determine that any part of this article, or any application of enforcement of it is excessively restrictive of such rights or liberties, then such portion of this article, or specific application of this article, shall be severed from the remainder, which shall continue in full force and effect.
